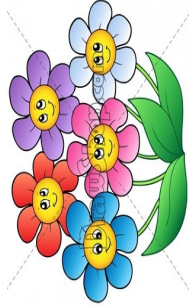

### A NOTE FROM PASTOR STEVE

When we were children and youth, most of us looked forward to summer break. Of course, the time seemed to fly by. It was not until school resumed that we realized those fleeting days were also a season of change. Not only were we older but we discovered the pants we wore on the last day of school were too short but when we were reunited with friends they too had changed and some of them actually spoke with a different voice. The summer actually was a time of change, which was exciting and also somewhat, unsettling. Well, we do not have to wait until August for us to realize that the “summer of ’18” will bring change to our church. We can already see the obvious changes that are occurring in our facility but there will also be a change in who we will see in the Chancel areas of our church on Sunday mornings.

By now you know that Rev. Jon Hand will be retiring from “full time” ministry at Annual Conference. Pastor Jon has agreed to serve as a part-time pastor in a local church and I will leave that to him to share as he feels appropriate. What I hope to convey to him, Anita and Sean is my personal appreciation and that of our congregation for their years of faithful service. I have conveyed to Jon that I will always feel a sense of pride in his ministry. Although he is officially retiring and taking a part-time church, he will actually be doing what he has been preparing himself for—the work of a lead pastor. So that you may prepare for this transition Pastor Jon will be preaching and leading worship at each service on June 3. (I will be away on vacation.) On June 10 we will be having a reception for “the Hands” in the gym at 10 am during the traditional Sunday School time. At 10:15 there will be a program. I would like to invite you to write a letter or card expressing your gratitude for Jon (it’s ok to write one for Anita or Sean as well). There will be a basket to collect these that morning. If you would like to assist in this please speak to Carolyn Watkins or Lucy Majors. Jon’s last Sunday will be June 17.

Officially moving day for preachers in the Tennessee Conference is June 26. Back in the days when every church provide a parsonage (a house), preachers moved out in the morning and the new one moved in that afternoon. With the advent of housing allowances that has changed somewhat. Sometime during June our new preacher(s) will settle into to their offices at the church and attend worship on July 1 and help lead worship on July 8.

We are receiving two pastors. In an email a few weeks ago I gave a more complete introduction to who they are. Many you already know Wanda Spencer, and her husband Duane. They are members of our congregation and most often have attended the 9:00 service. Wanda will be appointed as an “assistant pastor and minister of music.” You do not really need for me to explain the title (I will be glad

to do so in a conversation) other than for you to know that she is being appointed as a “lay pastor” by the Bishop. Although she cannot baptize, perform weddings, or consecrate Holy Communion she will be one of our pastors; and yes she can be called Reverend Wanda or Pastor Wanda. (Sorry Rev. Spencer (as in JD) is already taken!) Did I mention, summer ’18 will be a season of change?

The second appointment is Rev. Jin Kim. Rev. Kim is an Elder in full connection (same as yours truly) and will be coming to us from Belmont UMC in Nashville. He is a graduate of Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky. As an ordained Elder, he has the privilege of administering all the sacraments of the church. Presently his official title is Associate Pastor but will eventually have a more descriptive one such as “Pastor of Congregational Care and Evangelism.” Rev. Kim is married to Dana and they have one daughter, Eugene who will be a freshman at UT Knoxville in the fall. We are blessed to have Rev. Kim as a part of our community and church staff. We are fortunate to be part of an Annual Conference that strives to meet the needs of congregations while appropriately using the gifts and graces of its clergy. I am grateful to our Bishop and District Superintendent who took the initiative to make this appointment possible.

During the month of July, as a congregation, we will be having opportunities to welcome Pastors Wanda and Rev. Kim and their spouses.

I am excited to see what God has in store for all of us. I believe God has something wonderful in store for Pastor Jon and his new assignment. I believe God has put together a team here at Winchester First that will help all of us be more fruitful disciples of Jesus Christ!
